It's the law!

Seminole County Animal Services enforces County Codes as they apply to Animals and Fowl for the safety of the public.

IT IS UNLAWFUL FOR AN ANIMAL OWNER TO

- ALLOW YOUR ANIMAL TO ROAM-AT-LARGE (Including cats).
- PERMIT YOUR ANIMAL TO SOIL, DEFILE, URINATE, OR DEFECATE ON ANY PROPERTY OTHER THAN THAT OF THE OWNER WITHOUT EXPRESSED OR IMPLIED CONSENT.
- LET YOUR ANIMAL MAKE OBJECTIONABLE NOISES WHICH DISTURB THE COMFORT OF THE NEIGHBORS.
- LET YOUR ANIMAL DAMAGE, HARM, OR DESTROY PROPERTY NOT BELONGING TO THE OWNER.
- LET YOUR PREMISES EMIT OBJECTIONABLE ODORS.
- ALLOW A CAT OR DOG THAT IS IN HEAT TO REMAIN OUTDOORS.
- KEEP A FIERCE OR DANGEROUS ANIMAL UNCONFINED.
- TRANSPORT AN ANIMAL IN AN OPEN VEHICLE UNLESS HOUSED IN A CONTAINER DESIGNED FOR THAT PURPOSE.
